

Required by the Federal Transit Administration

Provides strategic direction for the UDOT Rural Public Transit team (RPT)

Why is the Intercity Bus Study important?







Provides access to social services, employment, education, recreation, medical, shopping, etc. Improves quality of life by providing mobility options Improves and expands access and connectivity to the nation's intercity bus network

What are the 2023 Intercity Bus Study Project Goals?

Create a vision for the intercity bus network

Identify how intercity bus services can better connect to local, regional, and intercity transit modes

Determine priorities and develop a phased implementation plan

Enable UDOT's Rural Public Transit team (RPT) to make informed decisions



What is UDOT's Role?

UDOT manages and allocates FTA 5311(f) funding

15% of annual 5311 apportionment goes to intercity bus



What are the priorities for 5311(f) funding?



Connecting nonurbanized areas to the larger regional/national system of Intercity Bus service




Supporting service to meet the intercity travel needs of residents in nonurbanized areas ¥= **=


Planning, marketing assistance, capital investments for intercity infrastructure investments

*UDOT currently funds two Salt Lake Express routes with 5311(f)




